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REACH compliance about products supplied by TURCO ESPAÑOLA, S.A.

Dear Customer,

This document explains the situation of TURCO ESPAÑOLA, S.A. about the Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH).

Our products are manufactured from mixtures of substances and/or preparations, which are imported or bought from other European suppliers; consequently our role under REACH is downstream user role.

TURCO ESPAÑOLA, S.A. has implemented internal procedures to assure all substances comply with REACH.

REACH phases

REACH is being developed in 3 phases, depending on manufactured/imported substances:

Phase 1 - 2010 deadline: 1000 tonnes or more per year, CMR substances (carcinogenic, mutagenic and toxic to reproduction) and very toxic to aquatic organisms substances.

Phase 2 - 2013 deadline: 100 tonnes or more per year.

Phase 3 - 2018 deadline: 1 tonne or more per year.

Pre-registration and registration

In phase 1 and phase 2, our suppliers pre-registered the supplied substances and, in some specific situations, we did the pre-registration.

After deadlines, the registrations were obtained to keep supplying the substances.

Registration numbers can be consulted on Safety Data Sheets (SDS), section 3.

At the present time we are in phase 3, May 2018 deadline.

In the same way as we did in previous phases, we are doing the required procedures to ensure we are using substances that are complying with REACH, verifying the status for each registration with our suppliers.

New registration numbers will be notified in next SDS updates.

Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC)

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) publishes the list of substances of very high concern (SVHC), which are candidates to be included in the Annex XIV of REACH (authorisation list). This list is periodically updated and can be consulted via the following link <http://echa.europa.eu/candidate-list-table>.

We will report the presence of SVHC in our supplied products through the SDS.

Authorisation (Annex XIV)

The incorporation of a new substance in Annex XIV implies additional procedures, one of them the obligation to obtain an authorisation. The list of affected substances to authorisation is periodically updated and can be consulted via the following link <http://echa.europa.eu/addressing-chemicals-of-concern/authorisation/recommendation-for-inclusion-in-the-authorisation-list/authorisation-list>.

TURCO ESPAÑOLA, S.A. is doing the required procedures in relation to authorisations and uses to assure that our products comply with REACH. Also we will keep our customers properly informed of any incident in the continuity of supplies because we cannot certify that authorities will grant the requested Authorisations.

Related news about affected substances to Authorisation will be reported via our SDS and labels. According to the REACH regulation, the granted Authorisation for specific use(s) will only apply to the chemical suppliers that are applicants for the Authorisation and their downstream supply-chain.

After the sunset date, you may only use the substance if an authorization has been granted to an actor up your supply chain, or if an actor up in your supply chain has applied for an authorization before the latest application date but the decision is pending.

All companies that may be permitted under the Authorisation regime to use a substance - must, in addition to other applicable legal requirements, comply with the conditions of the Authorisation specified by the European Commission. These conditions may include safety and environmental protection measures such as, but not limited to, engineering controls, personal protective equipment and emissions and exposure monitoring.

Please refer to the workplace safety and environmental requirements described in the Chemical Safety Reports which are included in the Applications for Authorisation. These documents are available on the ECHA website.

Safety Data Sheets (SDS) – CLP labelling and classification

Our products have been classified according to CLP regulation, which is notified in SDS and labels. The SDS format is regulated in Article 31 and Annex 2 of REACH. SDS are updated as soon as significant changes are detected.

Extended Safety Data Sheet (eSDS) – Exposure Scenario (ES)

REACH has established the obligation to prepare Exposure Scenarios for certain substances, depending on their hazardousness and handled quantities.

Exposure Scenarios are designed to document the conditions of safe use of the substances (operational conditions such as duration of use, concentrations and risk management measures such as ventilation conditions, personal protective equipments).

When a product contains a single component, which its exposure scenarios are available, we will provide them annexed to the SDS.

In the case of mixtures, which do not have available all the exposure scenarios, we are adapting our FDS progressively considering that the registration deadline for certain substances ends in 2018.

TURCO ESPAÑOLA, S.A. is aware of its obligations regarding REACH, that is why we are working with our suppliers to ensure strict compliance with the regulation and safety for our customers.
